

# Line



**Line:** An element of art that is used to define shape, volume, and surface, that to suggest mass and volume. It may be a continuous mark made on a surface with a pencil/brush or implied by the edges of objects and forms.

**Characteristics of Line are:**

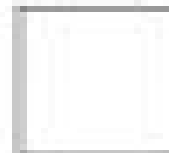
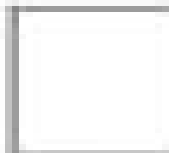
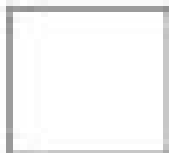
- **Width:** \_\_\_\_\_

**Types of Line:**

1. **Outline Line:** Lines that define the \_\_\_\_\_ of an object or its elements.
2. **Section Lines:** Lines that indicate the existence of an object's interior or of a hole.
3. **Implied Line:** Lines that are not actually drawn but created by a \_\_\_\_\_ of objects seen from a distance. The directions are related to pointing to, or the direction of, something looking at.
