

Format for Works Cited Page -- MLA

General notes on Works Cited or Bibliography Pages:

- Alphabetize your Works Cited Page according to the authors' names, not according to the format.
- Dates are usually written in the following form: "1 Jan. 2007." Don't abbreviate May, June, July.
- If an article is "unsigned" – that is, there is no author given -- then begin with the title. Alphabetize the work by the title.
- "Hanging" Indentation should be selected in *Microsoft Word* under Format Paragraph.

Webpage	<p>Last Name, First Name. "Title of Webpage." Last update (if given). Date of access <URL>.</p> <p>Example: U.S. Government Printing Office. "Constitution of the United States: Main Page." 15 July, 2004. 09 Feb. 2005 <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/constitution/index.html>.</p>
Magazine	<p>Last, First. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Magazine</u>, Date: Page range.</p> <p>Example: Moffett, Mark W. "Ants and Plants: Tree Fortresses." <u>National Geographic</u>, May 2000: 84-97.</p>
Newspaper	<p>Last, First (if given). "Title of article." <u>Name of Newspaper</u>. Date: Section and Page.</p> <p>Example: McHugh, David. "Once-battered euro stages a comeback." <u>The Prince George's Journal</u>. 24 Aug. 2001: A7.</p>
Non-print Media	<p><u>Title</u>. Type of media (for example, Videocassette, CD-ROM, etc.). Publisher, Year.</p> <p>Example: <u>Rocky Mountain Beaver Pond</u>. Videocassette. National Geographic, 1987.</p>
Graphic	<p>Last, First (if known). "Title of Image." Type of image. Title of Web Page. Date of last update. Date of access <URL>.</p> <p>"Fibonacci Squares." Graphic, <u>Fibonacci Squares</u>. 21 June 2007 <http://www.textilesounds.com/images/fibonacci.squares1.gif>.</p>
Online resources	<p>Newspaper on Web: Author. "Article Title." <u>Newspaper</u> Date of Article. Date of access <URL>.</p> <p>Example: Stuever, Hank. "Cathy and Irving, the Honeymoon Is Way Over." <u>Washington Post</u> 9 Feb. 2005. 9 Feb. 2005 <http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/articles/A9571-2005Feb8.html>.</p> <p>Database article: Author.
