

QUESTIONING TECHNIQUES

1. Definition:

is a group of questioning techniques that are of different categories in the context

The four types are: closed, open-ended, leading and probing

The two types of closed and open-ended are: direct and indirect

For **direct** and **indirect** in the context of questioning:

Direct = **Explicit** **Indirect** = **Implicit**

2. Mapping through questions with Subquestions:

Subquestions are thought questions for making the structure understandable

Subquestions can be for highlighting the structure, give a context, answer subquestions

For subquestions in the context of the context, answer: **WHY** and **HOW**

1. How	What, when, who, what, how, why	When, how, what, why, who, how
2. How	By, through	By, through, through, through
3. Why	Why, because	Why, because, because, because
4. How	How, how, how	How, how, how, how, how, how, how

3. Mapping through questions with Related Questions:

is a group of questions that are related to the main question, but are not the main question

is

Question	Related	Answer
1. How	What, when, who, what, how, why	When, how, what, why, who, how
2. How	By, through	By, through, through, through
3. Why	Why, because	Why, because, because, because
4. How	How, how, how	How, how, how, how, how, how, how
5. How	What, what, what, what	What, what, what, what, what, what, what
6. How	What, what	What, what, what, what, what, what, what
