They thought he did a well job on defending Tom Robinson for the circumstances. Though in this novel had a great deal of courage it also had prejudice.

Prejudice is also a main part of this novel. People are prejudice to Dolphus Raymond because he would rather hang out with black people then white people. They make up an excuse that he is the town drunk and rather except him as that than liking black people more than white people. Tom Robinson also gets accused automatically of raping Mayella Ewell because he is black. "In a far corner of the square, the Negroes sat quietly in the sun dining in sardines, crackers, and more vivid flavors of Nehi Cola, Mr. Dolphus Raymond sat with them. Jem said dill, he's drinking out of a sack. Mr. Dolphus raymond seemed to be so doing; two yellow drugstore straws ran from his mouth to the depths of a brown paper bag. Ain't ever seen anybody do that, murmured Dill. How does he keep what's in it in it, Jem giggled. He's got a Coca-Cola bottle full of whiskey in there. That's so not to upset the ladies, you'll see him sip it all afternoon and he'll step out for a while and fill it back up (TKAM, p205)." This quote is saying they think he drinks but he really disguises it with Coca-Cola because that's the reason the whites think he hangs out with blacks. All the white people were mad at him and came up with excuses that he is an alcoholic and that's why he hangs out with the black people. Although prejudice took place in this novel, so did honesty and integrity.

This novel also shows the characteristics of honesty and integrity. When Atticus tells his children that he is going to take the Tom Robinson case because if he didn't it would not show his children, Jem and Scout, the difference from right and wrong. Also when Atticus says he can not lie to his children. He says, " If I lie to my children, then I will become a bad example (TKAM, P173)." This quote came after Atticus had just accepted the trial offer to Tom Robinson. Atticus believes in telling the children about all that he knows and not holding back. He does not want to fail his children and lie to them about things that are not right, like prejudice. Also he took this case to show his children the difference between right and wrong, whites versus blacks.

In the novel To Kill a Mockingbird, Harper Lee three themes: courage, prejudice, and honor and integrity.
