

4. Multiple-Choice Questions (10)

- 1) Theseus, Duke of Athens is planning to marry Queen Hippolyta
- 2) Eggeus, an Athenian politician, instructs his Theseus to consult with his daughter, Hermia, and her guardians, Demetrius and Lysander.
- 3) Eggeus wishes Hermia to marry Demetrius (his own nephew), but Hermia is in love with Lysander and refuses. Eggeus asks for the first possibility of how if Hermia should not follow wishes. This could mean death.
- 4) Hermia and Lysander plan to elope to Athens the following night and marry in another city.
- 5) Hermia decides to flee with Lysander, Helena, who was once engaged to Demetrius and Egeus's son, but she has left her other suitor, Demetrius.
- 6) Hoping to regain his love, Demetrius tells Demetrius of his plan that Hermia and Lysander have planned. Demetrius asks the woods what he intended to do and his lover, Helena follows behind him.
- 7) In these other woods are two new different groups of characters. The first is a band of fairies, including Oberon, the fairy king, and Titania, his queen.
- 8) The second is a band of Athenian craftsmen who are so busy that they have to postpone for the duke and his bride.
- 9) Long, Oberon's jester of the attraction queen, goes to a young, captain boy and wants to seek revenge.
- 10) Oberon sends his fairy servant, Puck, to capture a magical flower, the juice of which can be used to make sleeping person's eyes. Because that person is in love with the first thing he or she sees upon waking.
- 11) Puck, using the flower, and Oberon tells him of his plan to separate Lys and the sleeping Helena's eyes.
- 12) As they sleep Demetrius, not seeing toward Helena, he opens Puck to spread some of the juice on the duke's into his eyes.
