PREFIXES PRACTICE

A prefix is a letter or group of letters that is added to the beginning of a word. The prefix re-means "to do again." re + gain = regain - the prefix is "re" and the base word is "gain."

Example A: I watched a re-run of the TV. show.

Answer: I watched a re-run of the TV show. base word = run
