Part One: Complete Sentences

RULE: Complete sentences must have a subject (noun) and a verb (action). They are complete thoughts on their own.

-Complete: Jenny hates English class.
-Not Complete / Fragment: In the morning.

Part Two: Combining Sentences

RULE: Complete sentences that have a subject (noun) and a verb (action) can only be combines with a semicolon, a colon or comma / conjunction (and, but, or, for, nor, yet, so). They can be separated with a period. They <u>cannot</u> be put together with a comma alone or nothing.

- -Correct: Bill is the best; he paid for my ticket to Eliches.
- -Correct: My sister wants to go, but she is too young.
- -Incorrect: My uncle is crazy, he has eight dogs.
