

Reflexive Verbs

Reflexive verbs generally follow the pattern of normal -er verbs but they need the reflexive pronoun in between the personal pronoun and the verb. The reflexive pronoun often means 'get'. It also describes when the action reflects back upon the person/people who is/are doing the action to mean 'each other' 'myself' 'yourself' 'themselves'.
E.g. Ils s'adorent = they love each other.

E.g.

Je **me** lave

Tu **te** laves

Il /Elle **se** lave

Nous **nous** lavons

Vous **vous** lavez

Ils/Elles **se** lavent

Here are some useful reflexive pronouns:

se réveiller ⇒ to wake up

s'amuser ⇒ to have fun

se lever ⇒ to get up

se bronzer ⇒ to sunbathe

se laver ⇒ to wash

se brosser ⇒ to brush

s'habiller ⇒ to get dressed

se baigner ⇒ to bathe

se coucher ⇒ to go to bed

se promener ⇒ to walk

se doucher ⇒ to shower
