What is "debate"? Learning objectives

Argument – two sides don't agree with each other

A **debate** is a competition. Two teams are prepared to support their side and disagree with the other team.

There will be a judge. They will have questions to ask the teams before.

Each team will have a given side. There is a 'PRO' and another 'CONTRARY' side.

- PRO means you agree with the topic. You must find reasons why it is CORRECT.
- CONTRARY means you disagree with the topic. You must find reasons why it is WRONG.

Remember! It's not about WINNING OR LOSING!

If you agree the PRO team, even if you DON'T agree, your job is to argue that you do. If you are on the CONTRARY team, even if you DON'T agree, your job is to say that you don't.

Every student will have a chance to speak in a debate.

Students will also be evaluated, you can see why the other team is wrong.

The teacher will judge the competition and decide who the winners are!
