

TABLE OF NEUM TERMS

A. Present Tenses

Present: I <u>am</u> (to <u>be</u>)
Usage 1: <u>Present Habitual Action</u> Example: I <u>go</u> home every day. 
Usage 2: <u>Present Habitual Action or present situation</u> — these are described in the past time in the present, written in the future. Example: People generally <u>go</u> home in the evening. 
Usage 3: <u>Present Habitual Action or present situation</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • present in the PAST with the present conditional to indicate a situation that is not going to happen in the present or past. • <u>Present Habitual Action or present situation</u> to indicate an activity or habit in the past or present. • <u>Present Habitual Action or present situation</u> to indicate an activity or habit in the future. Example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (1) I <u>am</u> <u>going</u> to <u>be</u> a doctor when I <u>grow</u> up. (2) I <u>am</u> <u>going</u> to <u>be</u> a doctor when I <u>grow</u> up. (3) I <u>am</u> <u>going</u> to <u>be</u> a doctor when I <u>grow</u> up.

B. Present Continuous

Present: I <u>am</u> <u>going</u> (to <u>go</u>)
Usage 1: <u>Present Continuous</u> — action that is in progress at the moment of speaking. Example: I <u>am</u> <u>going</u> home now. She <u>is</u> <u>going</u> home now. They <u>are</u> <u>going</u> home now.
