Change	Point of View
<p>Ask these questions about a character you like:</p> <p>1. Look for changes in setting, character's thoughts, feelings, actions, motivations, conflict, plot, types used etc... ANY CHANGES?</p> <p>2. At the point of change, ask yourself - "What can be learned from this change?"</p> <p>3. Drawing a statement that shows the knowledge and lesson learned - <b>WHAT IS THE LESSON?</b></p> <p><b>Example:</b> <b>Thinking Person:</b> The author starts with happy characters... then... then... it ends with an unhappy character. What is the lesson here?</p> <p><b>What lessons can be learned at this point?</b></p> <hr/> <hr/> <hr/>	<p>Establishing other and trying my own different techniques like one the first one changes everything etc. etc.</p> <p>No answer for one. Point of View is the best answer:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Point of view especially in multi characters.</li><li>2. Pretend that you are a tree. It is important to really shift your thoughts so that you can think and feel like your character.</li><li>3. Point of view not to the best solution or ends</li><li>4.
