D. Explain that some people do not have enough money to buy what they need and cannot eat whenever they are hungry. Charlie's father does not earn enough money to buy what the family needs. As a result, his family cannot afford beds for everyone, new clothes for Charlie, or enough food for everyone.



- E. Explain that people around the world do not have enough money and have to live in **homeless shelters** or outside. (Explain what a homeless shelter is.)
- **F.** Discuss what the class can do to help people in need. Emphasize the relationship between the cause (how the class can help) and effect (what the help will mean to those receiving the assistance). Some possibilities include having a class or school food, toy, or clothes drive.

Closure

Have students write a journal article from Charlie's point of view. They can discuss his daily life and/or his wish to find a Golden Ticket and why. Have students read through Chapter 15. Have them write another journal entry from Charlie's point of view after being inside the factory. The entries should be two short paragraphs. Have students help you create a rubric by which this assignment will be assessed. Use the Blank Rubric on Attachment 5.
