Excel Ch. 1 Notes and Definitions

- 1. Workbook a collection of worksheets.
- Worksheet allows users to enter, calculate, manipulate, and analyze data such as numbers and text.
- 3. Tables organize and store data within worksheets.
- 4. Sheet tab each worksheet has a sheet name that appears on a sheet tab.
- 5. Column heading a column letter above the grid identifies each column.
- **6.** Row heading a row number on the left side of the grid identifies each row.
- 7. **Cell** basic unit of a worksheet into which you enter data.
- 8. Cell reference cell's unique address. Ex. A1, D11, GG345, etc.
- 9. Active cell cell which you enter data.
- 10. Gridlines horizontal and vertical lines on the worksheet.
- 11. Worksheet window portion of the worksheet displayed on the screen.
- 12. Normal view default view.
- **13.Scroll bars, scroll arrows, scroll boxes** below and to the right of the worksheet window, used to move the worksheet window around to view different parts of the active worksheet.
- **14. Status bar** presents information about the worksheet, the function of the button the mouse pointer is point to, or the mode of Excel.
- **15. Mode indicators** Enter and Ready, appear on the status bar and specify the current mode of Excel.
- 16. Ready Excel is ready to accept the next command or data entry.
- 17. Enter Excel is in the process of accepting data through the keyboard into the active cell.
- 18.Keyboard indicators show which toggle keys are engaged.
- 19. Ribbon control center in Excel.
- **20. Tab** surrounds a collection of groups in the Ribbon.
- 21. Group contains related commands.
- **22. Home tab** the primary tab, contains groups with the more frequently used commands.
- 23. Active tab the tab currently displayed.
- **24. Ribbon commands** include buttons, boxes, and galleries.
- 25. Gallery set of choices, often graphical, arranged in a grid or in a list.
- **26.In-ribbon** gallery shows common gallery choices on the Ribbon rather than in a dropdown list.
- **27.Live preview** feature that allows you to point to a gallery choice and see its effect in the worksheet without actually selecting the choice.
- **28. Enhanced screen tip** on-screen note that provides the name of the command, available keyboard shortcuts, a description of the command, and sometimes instructions for how to obtain Help about the command.
- **29.ScreenTip** usually displays only the name of the command.
- **30. Dialog box launcher** the lower-right corner of some groups on the Ribbon has a small arrow called the **dialog box launcher**, when clicked displays a dialog box or a task pane.
- **31.Dialog box** contains additional commands and options for the group.
- **32. Task pane** a window that contains additional commands and can stay open and visible while you work on the worksheet.
- 33.Formula bar appears below the Ribbon.
