Forming Comparative and Superlative Adjectives

Write the comparative and superlative forms of these regular and irregular adjectives. The first one is done for you.

Remember:

- You cannot use more and –er with the same adjective.
Incorrect: Bill is more taller than I am.
Correct: Bill is taller than I am.
- Always use than after a comparative adjective: Bill is taller than his brother.
- Don't confuse than with then, which means at a later time.
- Follow spelling rules when adding endings.
