Locate and explain the following elements of personification in Macbeth. You will create this type of sheet for Othello.

Allusion - an implied or indirect reference to a historical, Biblical, mythological, or literary person or thing.

- 1. "...or memorize another Golgotha"
- 2. "Will all great Neptune's ocean wash this blood clean fro my hands?"
- 3. "Who's there i' the name of Belzebub?"

Personification – giving to an inanimate object a human attribute

- 1. "...with his brandished steel/which smoked with bloody execution"
- 2. "But treasons capital, confessed and proved,/have overthrown him"
- 3. "Time and the hour runs through the roughest day."
- 4. "...his virtues will plead like angels"
- 5. "The bell invites me"
- 6. "...where our fate...may rush and seize us?"

Simile: Comparison of two unlike things without using like or as

- 1. "Our captains, Macbeth and Banquo...as cannons overcharged"
- 2. "New honors come upon him, /Like our strange garments..."
- 3. "Your face, my thane, is as a book"
- 4. "...his virtues will plead like angels"
