Carbon dioxide leaves the body when you exhale.	Oxygen leaves the air sacs and passes into the bloodstream through capillaries.	Carbon dioxide enters the lungs by way of the capillaries and air sacs.	Air flows into the air sacs at the end of the tiny bronchioles.
	Air travels through many smaller branches from the bronchial tubes.	Air travels down two bronchial tubes, each leading to a lung.	
	Carbon dioxide is passed from the air sacs into the bronchial tubes.	Carbon dioxide, a waste product, is picked up from body tissues and carried through the bloodstream to the lungs.	
	Air enters the nose as you inhale.	Air enters the windpipe, or trachea.
