Subject Pronouns

Regular AR Verbs

Nouns: gender and number

- I. A subject pro-noun replaces a noun. In Spanish I we have learned the following pronouns:

Yo-I

Tu-you informal

El-he Ella-she Ud. You formal

Nosotros(as) We

Ellos-they (all guys or guys and girls) Ellas (all girls)

Uds. (y'all)

Remember that because verb ENDINGS change in Spanish it is okay to leave off the subject pronoun. You can however choose to use it for emphasis.

- II. Regular AR verbs: Most Verbs ending in AR use this formula:

Remember to remove the AR before you conjugate the verb!

Endings:	Yo-O	Nosotros-AMOS
	Tu-AS	<u> </u>
	El/ella/Ud.-A	Ellos(as)/Uds.-AN

Hablar:

Yo Hablo-I speak

Tu hablas-you speak

El/ella/ud. Habla-he/she/you formal speak

Nosotros hablamos-we speak

Ellos(as)/Uds. Hablan-they speak

- III. All nouns have a gender. Masculine nouns normally end in o, feminine nouns normally end in A.

a. Plurals:

i. If a noun ends in a vowel add S gato gatos

ii. If a noun ends in a consonant add es arbol arboles

iii. If a noun ends in Z, change the Z to C and add ES
