PREPOSITIONS
Prepositional Phrases

A prepositional phrase begins with a preposition. A phrase is a group of words. Therefore, a prepositional phrase is a **group of words that begins with a preposition.**

- Examples:
- on** the boat
 - after** the storm
 - from** my dad
 - with** his aunt
 - behind** the shed

Note that the last word is something you can see (concrete noun). Some will end in a noun such as *love* that you can't see (abstract noun). A prepositional phrase may also end with *me, him, her, us, them, you, it, or whom*.
