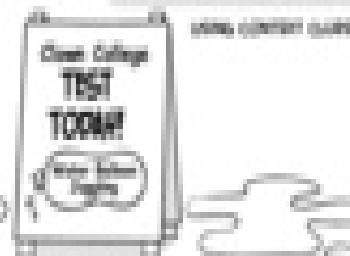


# TOP OF THE CLASS
