

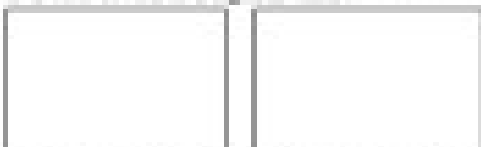
Oil Pastel Techniques

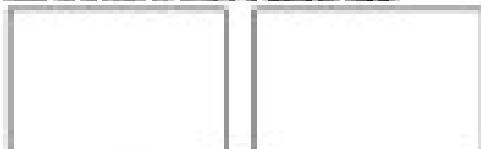
1. In the box below, take a primary color and blend them in the middle back into a secondary color.



2. In the [red] box below, add white to a color to make a tint. In the [green] box below, add a lighter shade color to a color to make a lighter color.



3. In the [red] box below, add black to a color to make a shade. In the [green] box below, add a darker shade color to a color to make a darker color.



4. Create a value scale by using only a paper towel or your finger to blend out the colors. Start with applying a color passing hard at the beginning of the box to gradually lightening up as your pressure as you move toward the center of the box.



5. Create a value scale with one color, adding black or white to it in a [red] or [green] transition of values. Use only a paper towel or your finger to blend out the colors.



6. **Blending:** Choose 2 colors to blend together. Apply 1 color in a color scale fashion passing hard at the beginning of the box to gradually lightening up as your pressure on it moves toward the center of the box. Do the same with the other color but from the opposite side. Use your finger or a paper towel to softly rub the color giving it a soft feeling. (2 times)



Choose a different color to blend together.



7. **Striping:** Start with a light color (soft) across the box with a darker color. Layer a group of dots at top of the first layer.



8. **Shading:** Value scale, blend using finger or Soften or Blend. Oil on a blending disk or cotton swab.



9. **Specialty:** Redder sand, more to watch off. First apply a light color to the paper and then go over it with another color until it is completely covered. Next, use a water brush to wash off the top color, revealing the colors underneath.
