Navy Day program and Presidential time-table covering today's historic celebration:

10:30 a.m.—Mayor LaGuardia and Grover Whalen, committee chairman, presented city's welcome to President Truman. Motorcade formed for trip to Brooklyn Navy Yard.

10:42 a.m.—The President arrived at Navy Yard.

11 a.m.—Commissioning ceremony for 45,000-ton carrier Franklin D. Roosevelt.

11:15 a.m.—President Truman delivered dedication address. Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt spoke.

12:05 p.m.—Mr. Truman and motorcade leave Navy Yard via Cumberland St. gate.

12:27 p.m.—Motorcade reaches Battery, turns north on Broadway, preceded by parade units.

12:40 p.m.—The President arrives at City Hall.

12:48 p.m.—The President, with motorcade, leaves City Hall to resume trip north.

1:15 p.m.—Motorcade enters Central Park at 59th St. and Avenue of the Americas.

1:30 p.m.—Arriving at Sheep Meadow, Mr. Truman publicly receives city's greetings from the Mayor and delivers second address.

2:21 p.m.—The President arrives at 79th St. yacht basin (opposite the Missouri).

2:28 p.m.—President Truman boards the flagship, to be greeted by naval and civic dignitaries.

2:30 p.m.—State luncheon for the President in Admiral's quarters. (Mrs. Truman and guests lunch separately.)

3:30 p.m.—The President leaves the Missouri to go aboard destroyer Renshaw, from which he is to review the Fleet.

3:40 p.m.—Renshaw arrives opposite 55th St. and circles cruiser Macon, first ship in line, then proceeds upstream to last craft, anchored near Spuyten Duyvil.

5 p.m. (approximately)—Arriving at end of line, Renshaw turns to port and starts downstream again on New Jersey side.

5:20 p.m.—Reviewing ship reaches 79th St., where USS Missouri gives her third Presidential salute of the day, concluding the review.

5:30 p.m.—The President is driven to Pennsylvania Station for return to Washington.
