Adjectives that are used to compare two people or two things have special forms.

- * If the regular adjective has one syllable, add **-er** to the end to make the comparative form. (Make the second consonant double if you have a consonant-vowel-consonant pattern word.)
 - * If the regular adjective ends in **y**, change the **y** to **i** before adding **-er**.
- * For many regular adjectives with two or more syllables, use the word **more** before the adjective, and do not add **-er**.
- * Use three irregular forms: good becomes **better**, bad becomes **worse**, and far becomes **farther**.
