Reindeer Glyph



Materials

- full sheets (12" x 18") of blue construction paper (background)
- half sheets of green and white construction paper (ground)
- small white paper plate (for body)
- brown tempera paint and brushes
- brown construction paper (for head, legs, and tail)
- white construction paper (for eyes)
- tan and black construction paper (antlers)
- red and black construction paper (nose)
- black crayon, glue, and scissors
- Reindeer Glyph Key for each student (page 24)
- Reindeer Glyphs Data page for each student (page 25)
- Reindeer Patterns (page 26)



Making the Reindeer Glyph

1. Read two different books about reindeer and fill in the titles on the student glyph key pages.
Suggestions: *Olive, The Other Reindeer* by Vivian Walsh and J. Otto Seibold and *Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer* by Robert L. May
2. Have each student make a reindeer body by painting a small paper plate brown.
3. Cut a large brown triangle for the head and 4 brown strips for legs. Make a tail with scraps.
4. When the painted paper plate is dry, glue the body parts to it.
5. Make eyes from the white construction paper and add black pupils. Glue the eyes to the head.
6. Have each student decide which story is his or her favorite.
 - If **Book 1** is chosen, cut a red circle nose and glue it on the head.
 - If **Book 2** is chosen, cut a black circle nose and glue it on the head.
7. Ask students if they have holiday lights on their homes or not.
 - If there are **lights**, black antlers are cut or torn and glued to the head.
 - If there are **no lights**, tan antlers are cut or torn and glued to the head.
8. Use the blue paper for the background. Ask each student if he or she prefers cold weather or warm weather.
 - If **cold weather**, make snowy ground by tearing a long strip of white paper for the ground.
 - If **warm weather**, make grass by tearing a long strip of green paper for the ground.
9. Glue the ground to the bottom of the page with the torn edge at the top. Match the bottom edges and sides so that none of the blue paper is seen at the bottom.
10. Glue the reindeer to the background.



Reindeer Glyph Analysis

1. Copy the Reindeer Glyph Key for each student to fill in.
2. Pair-share to examine and interpret each other's Reindeer Glyphs.
3. Sort the completed Reindeer Glyphs with students according to each question.
4. Fill in the Reindeer Glyphs Data analysis page as you answer each question.
