Camp Grammar . Day 4

Gerunds are nouns formed from verbs. Gerunds are formed by adding ING to verbs.

There are a few spelling rules that you need to know in order to form gerunds correctly. The spelling of a gerund depends on the **vowels** (a, e, i, o, u) and **consonants** (b, c, d, f, etc.) at the end of the verb.

Rules:

- 1. If there is more than one consonant, just add ING $\,$ (think + ing = thinking).
- 2. If there is more than one vowel, just add ING (beat + ing = beating).
- 3. If there is one vowel and one consonant, and the syllable is stressed, double the consonant and add ING (hit + t + ing = hitting)
- 4. If there are one or more consonants and E, remove the E and add ING (take + ing = taking)
- 5. In most other cases, just add ING (study + ing = studying; see + ing = seeing)
