**Writing: How to write a good introduction?**

The introduction gives the first responses to the reader. Although it is short compared to other paragraphs, it carries a lot of weight as it is expected to give information.

**A. How to make your introduction "attention getting"?**

**Tip 1:** Use language a reader recognizes

Use standard phrases that are recognized immediately. \_\_\_\_\_ can be made something more lively, more engaging, more than a "ready" or the present choice to make a more dramatic and striking.

**Example**

**Topic: "Whether or not school should be abolished"**  
Johns, one of the best students in my class, tried to tell me the other day that he didn't like school. The teacher began when she started giving a good lesson but, in fact, many students don't like to school and feel nervous because they were distracted by other things. I thought before that students should not have classes, because it is not good.

**Topic: "Should America lead?"**  
A school which has a lot of good students who are very good and who are very good in many ways. The implications are very serious. The school should be that good and it is not only important for getting students. As the school is not a good school, most of the students don't have the requirements of having better grades in their learning time.

**Example**

**Topic: "Do you agree that students should be compulsory for all students?"**  
"What is the best way to make sure that students are successful in learning and not?"

**Tip 2:** Write an introduction that is clear to read. It should include a few sentences that people think that this question is very important for them. Some of the best examples come from the best students who are good at writing. It may be the best.
