

CONDITIONAL SENTENCES " IF " CLAUSES

TYPE I: POSSIBLE CONDITIONS

If <u>(Present)</u> , <u>(Future)</u> or <u>(Future)</u> if <u>(Present)</u>
--

If I **finish** my work early tonight, I'**ll** go to the movies.

TYPE II: CONTRARY-TO-FACT CONDITIONS: PRESENT TIME

If <u>(Past)</u> , <u>(Conditional)</u> or <u>(Conditional)</u> if <u>(Past)</u>
--

If I **had** more money, I'**d** buy clothes and shoes for each day.

TYPE III: CONTRARY-TO-FACT CONDITIONS: PAST TIME

If <u>(Past Perfect)</u> , <u>(Conditional + Present Perfect)</u> or <u>(Conditional + Present Perfect)</u> if <u>(Past Perfect)</u>
--

If I **had brought** my camera to class, I **would have taken** pictures.
