Bingo's Story

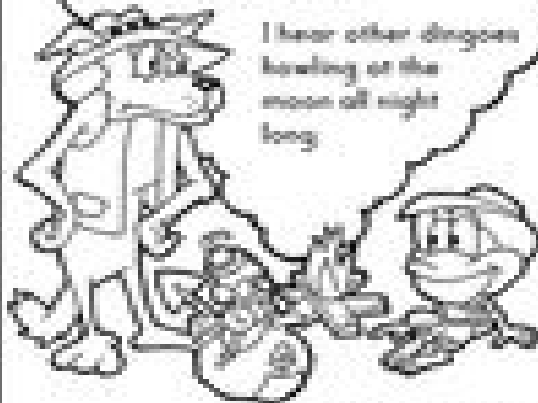
I see and hear many things at night

- Who/What? (questions involving recall of facts in the story)
- Why? (questions that ask the reader to analyze the facts)
- What would happen if . . . ? (questions that ask the reader to predict an outcome)
- Should the character have . . . ? (questions that ask the reader to evaluate what happened)
