

## Pronunciation Practice Exercises for final 'ed'

All voiceless sounds take /t/. Voiceless sounds are made by pushing air through your mouth; no sound comes from your throat.	Voiced sounds take /d/. Voiced sounds come from your throat. If you touch your neck when you make a voiced sound, you can feel your voice box vibrate.	"T", and "D" sounds take /ɪd/. The sound /ɪd/ adds a whole syllable to a word.
Examples of voiceless sounds: "K", "F", "S", "Ch", "Sh", "P"	Examples of voiced sounds: "L", "V", "N", "B" and all vowel sounds.	Examples: Looked → look/t/ = one syllable Needed → need/ɪd/ = two syllables
<b>EXAMPLES:</b> looked → look/t/ clapped → clap/d/	<b>EXAMPLES:</b> smell → smell/d/ saved → save/d/	<b>EXAMPLES:</b> decided → decide/ɪd/ needed → need/ɪd/
