

Circle the correct partial differential equation for the function below.

1) Transformed 1 into 2 only

$$f(x,y) = y^x - 2$$

2) reflected over the x-axis

$$f(x,y) = -(y^x)$$

$$f(x,y) = -y^x$$

3) vertically stretched by 2

$$f(x,y) = 2(y^x)$$

4) horizontally stretched by 2

$$f(x,y) = y^{\frac{x}{2}}$$

5) Transformed 1 into 10 only

$$f(x,y) = y^{10x} - 10$$

6) reflected over the y-axis

$$f(x,y) = y^{10-x}$$

7) vertically compressed by $\frac{1}{2}$

$$f(x,y) = \frac{1}{2}(y^x)$$

8) horizontally compressed by $\frac{1}{2}$

$$f(x,y) = y^{\frac{2x}{1}}$$

Circle the correct partial differential equation for the function below.

1) Transformed 1 into 2 and 3 only

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (x^2 - 2) = 3$$

2) reflected over the x-axis

$$f(x,y) = -4 \cos y x^2$$

3) vertically stretched by 4

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y x^2$$

4) horizontally stretched by 2

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (2x^2)$$

5) horizontally compressed by $\frac{1}{2}$

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (\frac{x^2}{2})$$

6) Transformed 1 into 10 and 11 only

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (x^2 + 1) = 5$$

7) vertically stretched by 4

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (x^2)$$

8) vertically compressed by $\frac{1}{4}$

$$f(x,y) = \frac{1}{4} 4 \cos y x^2$$

9) horizontally compressed by $\frac{1}{2}$

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (\frac{x^2}{2})$$

10) Transformed 1 into 10 and 11 only

$$f(x,y) = 4 \cos y (x^2 - 1) = 5$$
