Are you fed up of your job? Ever thought about working from home to supplement your income? Well more and more people are doing just that and some have found niches in the most bizarre places. Learn how other people make money doing the strangest online jobs.

Video Gamer – Joseph Garrett has made serious money playing a video game called Minecraft. He records the games with a running commentary throughout which he uploads to YouTube. He generates millions of dollars from ad revenue and had to quit his job because he was taking home so much with the videos.

Eating Online - A new trend has hit South Korea and it involves eating. People will pay money to watch you eat at home, sometimes even up to a few hundred dollars a meal. One eater, known as The Diva, pockets \$9000 a month eating food and recording it live.

Sell your hair - There are websites out there who will buy your hair or sell you some. One woman sold 31 inches of it to a website for \$4000. The hair is used for wigs, dolls, ornamental flowers and jewellery.

Ads on your Face – Two British men set up a website in order to pay off their university debts. Each day they face paint a company's logo and website on their faces while they do funny things or stunts. When they started they charged £1 for an ad campaign, but as their popularity rose, they began to charge £400 per day. They have managed to pay off their university debts of £50,000.
