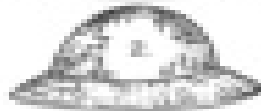

Winter is almost over and spring is right around the corner. Make a list of five different behaviors of animals during each of these seasons.



Pretend you are an animal that lives in a forest, jungle, grassland, tundra, or desert. Write a letter to an animal living in a different habitat. In your letter explain how you've had to adapt to your environment to survive.



Make a web that shows how an animal in your state senses its environment, moves, eats, communicates, and defends itself.



Research the features and behaviors of a baby animal. Then create a decorative birth announcement that includes a description of these characteristics.



Search for facts about the largest, fastest, loudest, or strongest animal. Create a postage stamp promoting this animal's unique quality.



Make a big book to share with a primary class. In the book, feature an unusual animal. Describe where the animal lives; what it looks like; what it eats; and how it moves, communicates, and defends itself.
