

This worksheet contains 100 simple sentences to practice conjugation of –AR, –ER, and –IR verbs. I designed it as an exam practice but it could be used at any point for any verb tense. (preterite, imperfect, present, conditional, future) You can decide what tense to assign to the packet. If you assign it as preterite homework, be aware that some verbs in the practice have irregular forms.

Each section contains a helpful box chart first for students to write out the regular verb endings.

Next come the sentences.

40 sentences using –AR verbs:

Now use the box chart to practice conjugating –AR verbs.

And 30 sentences using –IR verbs.

7. Tú \_\_\_\_\_ en una casa muy grande. (VIVIR)
8. Los vecinos \_\_\_\_\_ mucho correo. (RECIBIR)
9. Los víctimas \_\_\_\_\_ el accidente a la policia.  
(DESCRIBIR)
