Many cooking requirements for rank and for Cooking merit badge ask you to "tell why" or "explain" These worksheets facilitate meeting these types of requirements for Tenderfoot, 2 nd Class, and 1 st Class ranks. (The Troop provides other worksheets for Cooking merit badge.) Fill in your answer for particular requirement and present it to some one in the Troop who is qualified to sign off on cooking requirements. Be forewarned – that person will probably ask you to verbally answer a few related questions to insure you understand the substance of the material.
Some "tell me" and "explain" requirements have additional components. For example, Tenderfood Requirement #3 asks you to help with cooking a patrol meal, and to explain why it is important to pitc in. These worksheets only facilitate the "tell me" and "explain" portions of such requirements. The "do portions actually require that you perform a task – something you cannot accomplish by writing a few words on a sheet of paper. If a requirement listed below is indicated as "partial", it has one or more additional "do" components. If the requirement is listed as "complete", there are no additional parts of the requirement.
Page numbers noted in the requirement refer to the 11 th ed. Boy Scout Handbook.
