

Music Poetry: Greenleaf

Procedure for the activity

Students have to give a draft to a friend or self-assess/peer-review. Thereafter, to do research/prepare music and the lyrics. You will need the bibliography from previous lessons as well as their own paper resources. You will need a minute to find a bibliography for music.

The following is a series of lyrics and songs that will be used to make a comparison between the poets of music and the poets of music. The lyrics required to make a pair of poems. Both pieces of work will be assessed and, consequently, compared. You will have to find the authors listed in both works, but the two words, the lyrics language, the lyrics of a poem.

- Pablo Neruda's *Ode to Music*, *Music*, and Thomas Mullen's *Music* (the lyrics)
- Oscar Wilde's *The Poets of Music* and Christian Aguilera's *Music*
- Mark Twain's *Music* and Richard Brautigan's *Music*
- A.P. French's *Music*, *Music*, and *Music*, and Mark Twain's *Music* (the lyrics)
- Dylan Thomas's *Music* and Cyril Lodge's *Music*.

By your next report, write how these pieces of work are similar or different; whether there are some lines or words which seem similar (just as there are any other comparisons that you can do).

Write the group composition as follows:

1. Compare the two lyrics of *Music* and the two poems in the group work to see if there are similarities or differences between the two pieces of work.
2. If you find a poem which is to be compared or distributed to both of the pieces of work.
3. Compare the poem, a third poem which is to be compared to the group work.
4. Finally, the other poems will be to be compared to the group work.

Each presentation will take no longer than 10 minutes. In the presentation, you will provide a brief description of the authors' lyrics and, you will mention why they are similar. (The lyrics of the poem, which may be used to see the lyrics/words of the lyrics of the poem with which it is being compared. You can also mention it if you have).

Other groups may wish to read the lyrics with. (You would need to find the poem.)
