Newton's First Law

An object at rest will remain at rest unless acted on by an unbalanced force. An object in motion continues in motion with the same speed and in the same direction unless acted upon by an unbalanced force.

This law is often called "the law of inertia".

Newton's Second Law

Acceleration is produced when a force acts on a mass. The greater the mass (of the object being accelerated) the greater the amount of force needed (to accelerate the object).

This means the heavier an object, the more force you need to move it.

Newton's Third Law

For every action there is an equal and opposite reaction.

Basic Forces Relating to Motion

Gravity

attracts all objects in the universe to one another

Friction

when matter moves or tries to move across or through other matter
