

## Project 32: Medieval Tapestry Collage

Cold medieval castle walls were hung with brightly colored tapestries illustrating religious themes and legends, such as this fourteenth-century tapestry of King Arthur.
Rather than weaving a tapestry, make a cloth collage of a medieval subject, using this copy as a guide.

- 1. Collect pieces of scrap cloth.
- Cut a piece of plywood or masonite to a convenient size (12" x 15", for example).
- 3. Plan a design which will utilize the cloth scraps.
- Draw the design onto the plywood or masonite backing.
- Cut the scraps to shape, then glue to the backing with white glue.
- Draw details (faces, for example) on the cloth with felt-tipped pens.
- Build up the design with cloth scraps, then display as a decorative hanging.
