



### Project 32: Medieval Tapestry Collage

Cold medieval castle walls were hung with brightly colored tapestries illustrating religious themes and legends, such as this fourteenth-century tapestry of King Arthur. Rather than weaving a tapestry, make a cloth collage of a medieval subject, using this copy as a guide.

1. Collect pieces of scrap cloth.
2. Cut a piece of plywood or masonite to a convenient size (12" x 15", for example).
3. Plan a design which will utilize the cloth scraps.
4. Draw the design onto the plywood or masonite backing.
5. Cut the scraps to shape, then glue to the backing with white glue.
6. Draw details (faces, for example) on the cloth with felt-tipped pens.
7. Build up the design with cloth scraps, then display as a decorative hanging.
