Weekly Concept: Our Government

Essential Question: Why do we need government?

Genre: Narrative Nonfiction: Is a type of nonfiction that is written as a story. It presents facts and includes text features.

Skill: Cause and Effect: The cause is why something happened and the effect is what happened or the result.

Comprehension Strategy: Ask and Answer Questions: Ask questions about things you do not understand and then look for the answers.

Spelling: Inflectional Endings: ed. & ing.

Grammar: Pronouns (take the place of one or more nouns: he, she, they, who, whom)
Antecedents (the word the pronoun takes the place of or refers to)

Writing: Organization (strong paragraphs)
