

# Double Genitive

Double Genitive is another way to indicate possession.

He is a friend of mine. (= one of my friends)

Jack is a friend of Patty's. (= one of Patty's friends)

Jack is a friend of hers. (= one of her friends)

## Possessive Pronouns

I	mine
You	yours
She	hers
He	his
It	its
We	ours
They	theirs

The structure we use is: **determiner + noun + of + possessive pronoun**

John is **a cousin of mine**. (= one of my cousins)
