- Include all the ideas, not just the ones you understand. The general rule is ONE sentence per paragraph in the essay.
- Write in the present tense. "The author describes," or "Mr. Khalaf believes...."
- Use the point of view of the author/s. If the author is male, use the
 pronoun "he"; if the author is female, use the pronoun "she." If there is
 more than one author, use the pronoun "they." If you don't know the
 gender, ask someone who does know.
- Use your own words to paraphrase the author's ideas.
- Use academic words for the writing task such as narrates, describes, compares, contrasts, or analyzes to explain the author's task.

DON'T:

- Leave out important ideas.
- Include specific details or specific examples.
- Copy sentences, parts of sentences or phrases from the essay.
- Use quotations from the essay:
- Refer to the author by his or her first name. The author is Mr. or Ms. or just the last name.
- Use the following pronouns: I, me, my, you, our, we, us, our
 Remember this is from the author's perspective.
- 7. Use the words "is talking about" as in the sentence, "This essay is talking
