DEWEY DECIMAL SYSTEM

In 1876, an American librarian and educator named Melville Dewey invented a decimal system for classifying and cataloging books. The Dewey Decimal System has undergone twenty-two major changes since its invention. This system is used in libraries all around the world.

The main categories of the system are:

- 000 – 099 computers; information, and general reference
- 100 – 199 philosophy and psychology
- 200 – 299 religion and mythology
- 300 – 399 social science
- 400 – 499 language
- 500 – 599 science and mathematics
- 600 – 699 technology
- 700 – 799 arts and recreation
- 800 – 899 literature
- 900 – 999 geography and history
