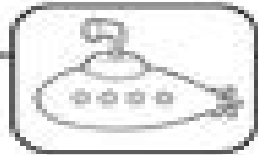


A digraph is made up of two or three consonants that together make one sound.

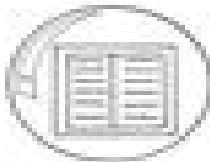

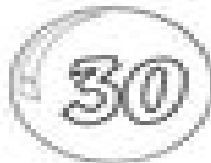

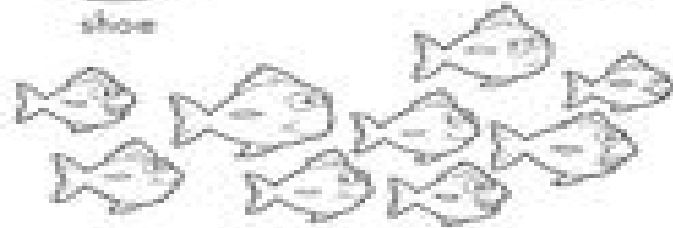

Label four paper plates sh, ch, wh, and th. Cut out several paper fish and write on each one a word that begins with one of the digraphs. For each word, draw a line in place of the digraph. (For example, write S _ _ for fish.) Put the fish in a paper lunch bag, and invite your child to go fishing! Let her to reach into the bag and select a fish. Have her determine the word on the fish, name the missing digraph, and place the fish on the corresponding paper plate. When all the fish have been caught and sorted, treat yourselves to a snack of goldfish crackers!
