Look at a work of art. Describe the line quality in the work of art using at least 3 descriptive words.

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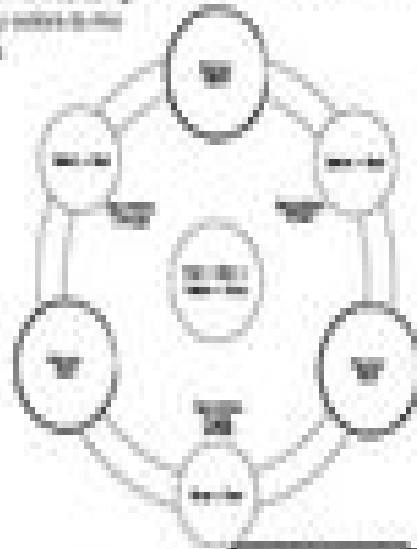
