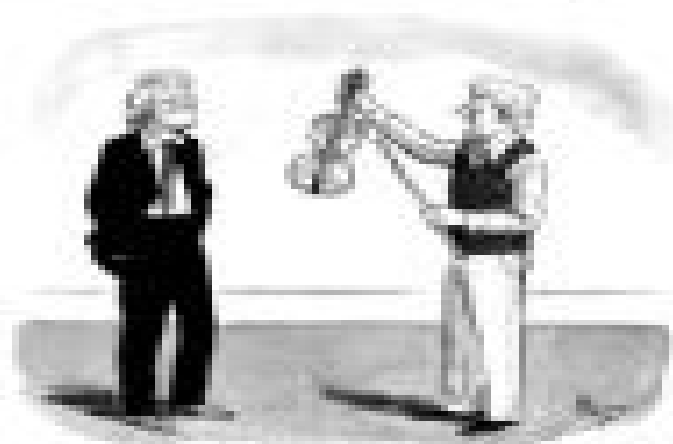


SAM AND HIS VIOLIN
