	Guidance Lesson Content	1. Have students take pre-test. [5 minutes] 2. Hand out Power Point to students (optional) (6 slides per page. Don't print Slide #1 if you want to keep on one page back to back) [2 minutes] 3. Discuss the first three slides. Emphasize the goals and that the post-test is the same as the pre-test. The post-test answers are what they should remember [3 minutes] 4. Talk about Slide 4. Give brief descriptions about each bullet point. Briefly describe why it is OK to be mad occasionally. Ask the students to tell a time when they or someone they knew got mad when it was justified. [5 minutes] 5. Present Slides 7-9. Tell brief stories on how these leaders dealt with anger. [5 minutes] 6. Describe internal and external sources of anger on Slides 11-13. [5 minutes] 7. Ask students to write what they think people's two biggest sources of anger are. Split up into groups to discuss and decide what are the two biggest sources of anger. Report groups' answers to the class. [8 minutes] 8. Review three benefits of anger and the Gandhi quote. Explain the next lesson [2 minutes]
