

Making Change by Subtracting



You can **make change by subtracting** the purchase price from the amount paid.

Example:
You buy a book for \$3.69. You pay \$5.00. How much change should you get?

Use subtraction to find the answer.

\$5.00	
- \$3.69	
\$1.31	You should get \$1.31 in change.
