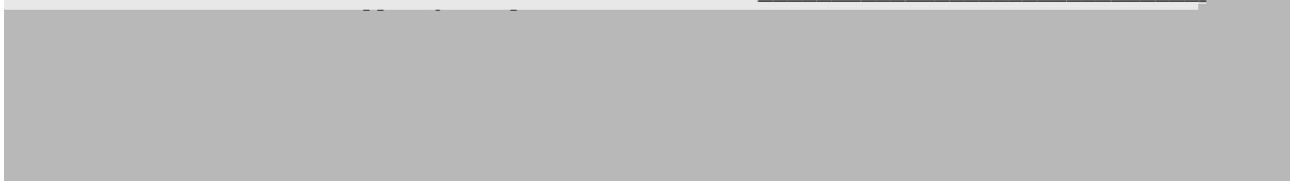


Bill of Rights Scenarios: Merit

On December 18, 1791, a 12-year old Philadelphia apprentice, Dillon, was arrested for turning down several stables containing hay and other goods.
