Bear River football team wins first Section football championship. Fire destroys 500 acres near Rough and Ready.
3. ____January is one of the wettest months ever, but February, March, April are driest ever. Bulls whip Jazz for 5th championship. Brown-Goldman families win \$33 million suit against OJ Simpson. Elvis still top seller for RCA despite being dead for 20 years. Green Bay wins Super Bowl: first for Packers since 1968.
4. ____ President Clinton becomes only second president to be impeached. Senate trial does not remove him from office. Mr. Vieira invades Europe. Kings make play offs, have winning record for first time since moving to Sacramento. Fifteen students killed in Colorado high school shootings. Worst drought in century hits Eastern United States. Latest Star Wars ("The Phantom Menace") movie takes in \$500 million at box office. NATO forces sent to Kosovo. Y2K has many people edgy.

8. ____ President Bush orders American armed forces to Persian Gulf to defend against Iraqi invasion (Operation Desert Shield.) Joe Montana leads 49ers to fourth Super Bowl victory. Huge February snowstorm closes local schools for a week, leaves some residents without power for more than a week. "March Miracle" rainfall saves Northern California from having little water for summer.
9. ____ Former country of Yugoslavia remains locked in bitter Civil War as Serbians fight Bosnians, Croatians in bloody conflict. Bulls repeat as NBA champions. Bear River selected as best having best all-around sports program in California for small high schools. Toronto is first Canadian team to win World Series.
10. ____"Jurassic Park" biggest movie of year. Floods devastate upper Midwest and Mississippi River areas. First Magnolia Renaissance Fair is huge success. Mrs. Boyer and Ms. Van Metre threaten 49er boycott after Joe Montana traded to Kansas City. Bulls Threepeat. Bill Clinton takes oath as 42nd President. Lady Bruins reach first state basketball final.
