Graffiti design and color theory Lesson Plan #1-Tag Design/enlargement graphing

Unit Title and theme: Graffiti design and Color theory

1. Course Level/Characteristics of the learners:

The students in this class are high school students attending Riverside University High School, an MPS school. We will be working with 9-12 grade level students in a 2-D foundations class. There will be two classes of about 35 students. There are several students who are ex-ed and need modified assignments.

2. Lesson number and title:

Lesson #1 Tag Design/enlargement graphing

3. Objectives:

A. Technical Skills

- Students will use graphing to enlarge their tag designs
- Students will learn techniques of successful graffiti designs
- Students will learn a step-by-step process to create a successful tag design with no prior experience.

B. Formal Content

- Students will consider proportion when enlarging their images onto a bigger sheet of paper.
- Students will successfully use line, shape, and original design to create their tags.

Looking and Talking

- Students will be introduced to the work of Banksy, a popular tag and graffiti artist that has a strong political theme to his art.
- Students will be introduced to many fonts and pictures of graffiti and tag designs
- Students will see short interviews with real street graffiti artists
- Students will be introduced to and will be asked to respond to why
 many artists use graffiti to get a message out

D. Expressive

 Students will use the knowledge gained and the visual examples to create tag designs of their own names/nicknames that reflect a blend of already created and their own font designs.

4. Integration with other subject areas:

Social Studies: Students will explore the history and the contemporary uses of graffiti design and tag art

Language Arts: Students will be expressing themselves through written language and stylized lettering
