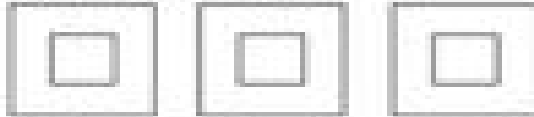


Color Worksheet

1. Place a primary color in the interior of a square box. Then, place in the complementary color to that primary color. Write the definition of complementary colors to the right.



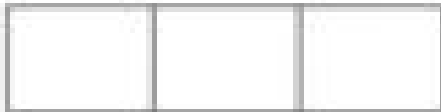

2. Place 3 analogous colors in the boxes below. Then, write the definition to the right.



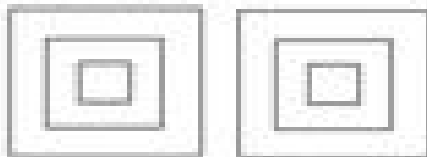
Analogous colors:

5. Place an achromatic scale. Then, write the definition below.

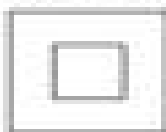

7. List all of the cool colors on the color wheel.

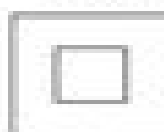
8. Mix a color. Place a warm opaque color in the interior box and an achromatic color in the exterior box. Then, write the definition to the right.



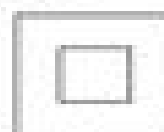
